Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance was at 7:00 p.m.

Present: Chairman Chuck Carlson; Vice-Chair John Dearing; Supervisor Larry Smith; Clerk/Treasurer Mary Barkley Brown; Maintenance Men Steve Jost and Brett Goelz.

Absent: Deputy Clerk/Treasurer Jean Just.

Approve or Amend Agenda, Town Board Meeting, September 6, 2022: A motion was made by Dearing, seconded by Smith, to approve the Agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously. Copies of the previous Meeting Minutes and this Meeting's Agenda are available for those attending this meeting.

Approve or Amend Minutes, Town Board Meeting, August 16, 2022: A motion was made by Smith, seconded by Dearing, to approve the August 16, 2022 Meeting Minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

Resolution Vacating Utility Easement and Certification of Resolution - Klug: A motion was made by Dearing, seconded by Smith, to approve Resolution No. 2022-11, A RESOLUTION APPROVING VACATION OF A DRAINAGE AND UTILITY EASEMENT IN THE TOWN OF CORINNA, WRIGHT COUNTY. Motion carried unanimously.

Maintenance Outlook Report and Calendar: Reviewed.

A motion was made by Smith, seconded by Dearing, to accept quote in the amount of \$5,384.00, from Hanson Silo Co., for new panels in salt shed. Motion carried unanimously.

A quote from Ceres Environmental in the amount of \$25,950 to grind and dispose of Corinna Township wood pile was reviewed. A verbal quote of \$6.00/yard plus one-time \$1,500 set-up fee, was also given to Steve Jost from Toft Outdoor. A motion was made by Carlson, seconded by Dearing to reject both quotes for disposal and instead - burn the pile again this year. Motion carried unanimously.

Corinna Township Clearwater/Pleasant Park Siren: A motion was made by Carlson, seconded by Smith, to accept quote of \$6,475.25 for new 50 foot power pole at siren, wrapped in stainless steel wire cloth as woodpecker deterrent, disposal of old pole, re-install salvage equipment onto new pole and set in place, electrical permit and inspect equipment when pole is down. Motion carried unanimously.

Electricity and Cameras Near New Gate at Town Hall: A motion was made by Dearing, seconded by Carlson, to accept quote of \$11,710.33 to run electricity to new gate, and to new light poles on Township Hall property. Quote from Driven Electric did not arrive by meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Smith, seconded by Carlson, to accept quote of \$8,271.00 for 4 cameras, in the amount of \$8,271.00, from Russell Security Resource, Inc. Motion carried unanimously.

MN LTAP: Clerk Brown is to sign up maintenance men for gravel road maintenance class.

State Park Road Applications: A motion was made by Carlson, seconded by Smith, to re-apply for this grant. Motion carried unanimously. Clerk Brown will call Bogart-Pederson Engineers.

Requests to be on the Agenda:

1. Susan DeRusha, 10800 Gulden Ave. NW RE: Driveway: Susan DeRusha did not attend. The maintenance men and town board had a discussion about the area in question. There is a power pole in the turn-around and there is a steep hill. The Township does not maintain this area.
2. Terry Strege asked to address the Town Board. He is a candidate for Wright County Commissioner. He said that he will have an "open door policy". He has worked 29 years as a sheriff's deputy. He is still a deputy. He has lived in the county since 1993. He has lived in Buffalo since 1998. He said that he is conservative.

5. Orderly Annexation Draft: No action taken by City of Annandale yet.
6. Dog Catcher Resignation: Corinna Dog-Catcher, Krista Grossinger called the Town Hall to report that she is no longer in the dog-catching business. Clerk Brown contacted the sheriff's department. Lieutenant Jeremy Wirkkula said the county does not currently have a dog-catcher, but can try to mediate the issues/concerns with animals on a case-by-case basis.
7. On-line Board of Appeal and Equalization Training: Reviewed. Dearing will take this class in the winter.
8. Weed Violation Letter of 8/19/2022 – The Preserve at Sugar Lake PID 206-140-002080 Hageman: Reviewed. Stacy Hageman called Town Hall to respond that they sprayed the weeds and it will take 5-10 days to become apparent. Dearing will check on weeds.
9. August 24, 2022 Notice of Potentially Dangerous Dog to Larry Kramer: Reviewed.
10. August 31, 2022 Notice of Potentially Dangerous Dog to Mr. Prestidge and Dog Vicki: Reviewed.


