YES – YOU PROBABLY NEED A PERMIT!

BUILDING, SEWER, LAND USE, and ZONING PERMITS

Please note that most construction or land alteration activities require a permit from the Township and often require compliance with the state building code. These include interior remodels, window or door replacement (even if the same size as before), decks, garden sheds, new structures or additions to previously existing structures, and **grading/filling activities**. If you are only replacing a previously existing structure to the same size - permits are still generally required. If your project doesn't involve the need for a permit, it still requires compliance with property line setbacks, impervious coverage limits, building coverage limits and other zoning regulations.

Building permits, sewer permits, land use applications and zoning applications are available at the Corinna Township Hall or at <https://www.hometownplanning.com/corinna-township-permit-applications.html>. You may drop off completed applications or plans in the drop box after hours. Please bring these permit applications to the Corinna Town Hall or apply via the Corinna Township website.

SHORELINE DISTRICT

Tree clearing, patios, and landscaping in or near shoreline areas is also regulated, and still requires compliance with property line setbacks, impervious coverage limits and other zoning regulations.

Always check with Township Staff or the Township Zoning Administrator, Ben Oleson, Hometown Planning at 320-759-1560 or oleson@hometownplanning.com before proceeding with a project to avoid problems. To apply for permits or for more information on the Land Use/Zoning Ordinance go to corinnatownship.com. You may drop off completed applications and/or plans in the drop box after hours. All permits are to be paid for and picked up at the Corinna Town Hall.

Winter/Snow Update

As a reminder, State Law prohibits plowing snow onto or **ACROSS** a public road and/or leaving snow piles on the road right of way. Please push snow piles back so they do not cause an accident or equipment damage as you may be held liable. No person shall park any vehicle, motorized or non-motorized, within any part of the traveled portion of a Road Right-of-Way at any time during or after a snowfall until the entire traveled portion of the Right-of-Way is plowed to its customary width.

*On service days, place garbage and recycling bins at least 4 feet from the shoulder of the road to avoid being hit by snowplow and grader equipment.

*On non-service days, do not leave your garbage or recycling bins on the side of the road.

*Our crews try to plow our roads as quickly and as often as possible. You can help. Anything parked in the right-of-way - cars, trucks, snowmobiles, docks, boats, RV's - slows down the plows and is a hazard to our drivers and equipment.

Corinna Township has an ordinance explaining what is allowed and what is not. In extreme cases, a violator may have their property removed or towed and a ticket issued. The Town Board hopes everyone will voluntarily comply with the rules.

ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY

No person shall place, maintain, or allow any obstruction in a Right-of-Way. Prohibited items include, but are not limited to, retaining walls, fences, posts, structures, piled materials, hay bales, vehicles, trailers, campers, boats, pontoons, docks, boat houses, fish houses, equipment, junk, or any other items that interfere with the safe use or maintenance of the Right-of-Way. No one may plant crops, trees, bushes, or shrubs within a right-of-way. No one may place watering systems or sprinkler heads within a right-of-way.

TOWNSHIP ROAD SUPPLIES

Please do not remove black dirt, sand, gravel or salt from the Corinna Town Hall property. Violators will be prosecuted.

Junk Clean-Up Day is tentatively planned for Saturday, July 25, 2026 from 7:30 AM to noon, at the Corinna Township Hall. You will receive a newsletter in July giving you more details about Junk Clean-Up Day.



Every-Other Week Commingled Recycling

Guidelines

Your recycling is single sort; you can place all items together in your container. They do not need to be sorted. Recycling cart may include the items listed below. We recommend setting your cart out the night before your recycling day.

**** Wheels should point toward your house, away from the street. Cart should be 1 foot from curb, not on the street. Cart should be 3 feet from any other obstructions such as mailboxes, trees, poles, etc. No bungee cords on the lid. IF IN DOUBT, NOTICE THE CART'S POSITION AFTER SERVICE AND PLACE IT THE SAME WAY EACH WEEK.**

ALUMINUM AND TIN CANS – Includes small scrap pieces of clean aluminum. Labels may remain on cans.

GLASS – Beverage and food jars only. Please rinse. All colors of glass are accepted. Labels may remain on glass. **NO BROKEN GLASS!**

PLASTIC– Please rinse. Labels may remain on containers. Items with #1, #2 and #5 in the recycling triangles are acceptable.

PAPER PRODUCTS/PAPERBOARD –

This includes newspaper, ad inserts, magazines, catalogs, mixed residential mail and paperboard. (Paperboard includes items such as cereal, snack and tissue boxes as well as paper grocery bags.)

CARDBOARD– Can accept small amounts of cardboard. No pizza boxes. Please break down cardboard to prevent it from getting stuck in your container.

Please discard items not recyclable as trash.

**** These items are not recyclable! ****

Styrofoam containers, waxed or food contaminated paper, drinking glasses, windowpanes, light bulbs, broken glass, paper towels and aerosol cans.

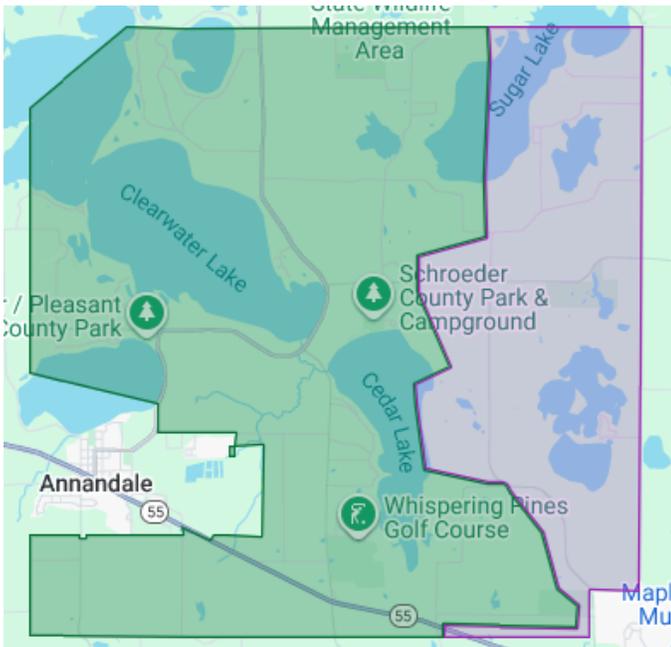
